## SAFEGUARDING

The designated member of staff for child protection may refer the matter to social care, the police or any other agencies. - Uses a spiral progression to develop fluency, reasoning and problem solving and conceptual understanding for 6 mastery.

Parents play a significant part in this learning journey. Parents are informed about what their children will be learning and are offered support and suggested ways in which they can play an active role in their child's development. **REGISTERS** – Class registers are a legal document and as such MUST be completed on time. School registers open at 8.45 (Nursery)/8.50 am (School) and close at 9.15. Afternoon session registers open at 12.30 (Nursery) 1.00 (KS1) and 1.15 (KS2). Any child arriving late after registration closure will be marked with U as per attendance policy guidance.

#### **EDUCATIONAL TRIPS & VISITS**

At Beacon we plan a variety of educational experiences for children throughout the academic year. As well as educational visits linked to curriculum areas, the children also have the opportunity to participate in trips which reward outstanding effort during each term. We do not arrange trips for children which are not linked to the curriculum.

When planning educational visits and trips:

- Produce a costed plan to ensure affordability
- Complete a risk assessment.
- Parental consent forms received from parents/carers.
- Emergency contact details available for all children on the trip/visit.
- Any family in receipt of Pupil Premium may request support for payment from this additional funding.

Children who are new to Beacon need to sign the consent form for trips within walking distance of the school. These can be found in the new starters induction pack which is distributed to all new children/families.

We have a dedicated member of staff, Mrs Broxton who works closely with our families and monitors attendance and punctuality. Mrs Broxton is also available to offer extended support to families who may require additional help with attendance and punctuality.

#### INCIDENTS/ACCIDENTS

Any incidents and accidents should be recorded and parents will be informed by text message of any administration of first aid via Arbor and /or verbally on pick up.

All staff have been trained in Paediatric first aid and all children will be given the opportunity to complete first aid training as part of the Greater Manchester local initiative. School always ensures that a registered and qualified first aider is on site and available at all times. Beacon Primary School first aiders are Mr Leaf and Mrs Turnbull.

## HOMEWORK AT BEACON

We encourage children to complete weekly homework – This should be provided on Friday and returned by Wednesday. We have a creative approach to homework activities, building on our Rainbow Challenges. Children benefit from reading frequently (EYFS/KS1 – 10-15 minutes per day and KS2 15-30 minutes per day). We also support children to access our remote education offer by providing weekly work on Microsoft Teams. All children will be given password to log on to Oxford owl, Sumdog, TT Rockstars, Purple Mash and Accelerated reader.



#### **COLLECTIVE WORSHIP**

Each day children come together for assembly time to reflect and join together as a family This is a time when the whole school or groups within the school meet together to engage in relevant, meaningful experiences, providing opportunities for the childrens' spiritual, moral, social and cultural development.

#### **BEACON GUIDING LIGHTS**

We have carefully coached a number of children alongside our wellbeing teacher to become guiding lights – these children showcase and lead mindfulness and meditation sessions to other classes throughout the school week.

#### **ONLINE LEARNING**

As part of the Forward As One Digital Strategy we encourage our pupils to access online learning tools such Purple Mash, LBQ, Sum Dog, Oxford Owl, Read Write Inc, Active Learning Power Maths, Microsoft teams, and TT Rockstars. We also have access to Britannica and Historical and Geographical Association.

These sites provide a secure platform for pupils to develop their reading, writing, and maths skills. PARENTS' MEETINGS – Each term school hold Parent Consultation meetings to update and share key learning and termly reports. Our RAG (RED, AMBER,GREEN) mentoring system clearly communicates how well each child is progressing both academically and attitudinally.

SEND pupils receive additional pupil passport meetings arranged each term with parents to ensure we work together on individual targets.

## **ENRICHMENT**

The extra-curricular life of Beacon Primary School is rich and varied. A wide range of activities are offered to the children, either at lunch time or after school, providing children with the opportunity to meet, teach and learn from each other in a relaxed and perhaps less academic atmosphere.

Children can pursue their interests in:

Art, sport, science, music, mindfulness, and their local environment.

We are also proud of the opportunities for children to participate in a wide range of sporting, dramatic and musical performances throughout the year.

#### ARBOR

At Beacon we use Arbor for the school MIS system . This records all attendance, pupil data and assessment information. We also use Arbor to record all key SEND provision and information. Arbor is also used as a primary tool to communicate with parents via text or email and to share school reports.

All payments for school breakfast club, uniform, trips or fees are also authorised and paid through the **cashless** system on Arbor.

### **COMMUNICATION STRATEGY**

As a member of Forward As One Trust we actively use MS Teams as our communication strategy and every member of staff has a work email address assigned to them. At Beacon we regularly collaborate across the Trust in a variety of learning communities and these are set up in channels as follows:
